This one day interactive course will review latest advances in the minimally invasive surgical approach to common general surgical problems.

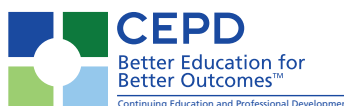
At the conclusion of this course, participants will be able to:

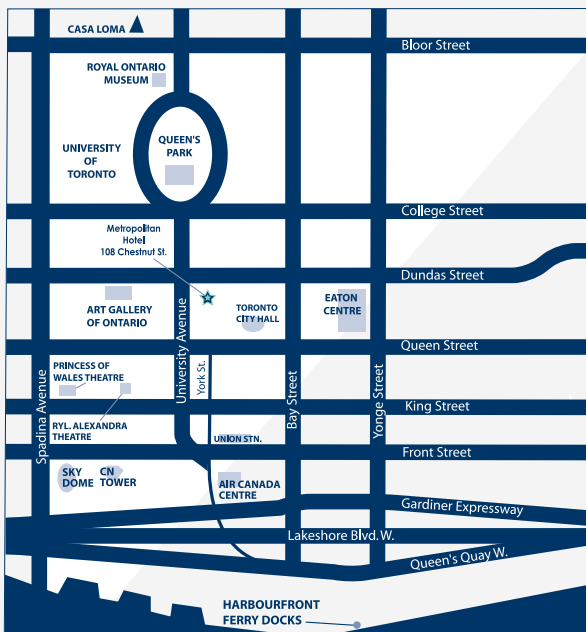
